QR CODES – WHAT ARE THEY AND WHY ARE WE USING THEM

This article will hopefully explain what a QR code is and why we as a group are using them.

QR stands for Quick Response and works in the same way as a barcode. The QR code is a square shaped black-and-white grid containing certain information—like web addresses or contact details—that you can access with a compatible device such as a smartphone or electronic tablet.

You find these QR codes pretty much everywhere: bars, gyms, grocery stores, cinemas, etc.

Importantly, a QR code cannot be hacked, but a hacker can generate a malicious QR code that sends you to a fake website where they can steal your personal information or data and can track your locations, so always try to verify where your QR code originated from.

Having a QR code as a link to a particular page on a website can be a lot easier than trying to remember the pathway to type into the internet portal (web Browser) to access the page. An example being to post the web address for the groups events page on its website would be: www.gscalekent.co.uk/events_diary.htm (Link has been de-activated), some pages have by far longer addresses so harder for people to quickly note down the address without making an error resulting in what they are trying to find. Scanning a QR code on a device such as a smartphone or electronic tablet can open the advised page on their browser so can be read at their convenience.

To scan a QR code it is fairly easy. You will need an enabled Smartphone or electronic tablet or similar device. You do not need a third-party application to do it.

- 1. Open your camera app/application.
- 2. Point the camera towards the QR code.
- 3. Your device (Smartphone or electronic tablet) will usually detect the link and will display usually with yellow markings around the QR code, it is asking if you would like to open the link. By touching the area, will usually open the link in your browser.

If you have an older smartphone or electronic tablet that does not recognise QR codes, you will require to install a QR code reader from where you get your applications. These are often free.

The QR code has certain instructions written within it. When you scan this code, your phone displays the information contained in the code. In case the code has an action on it, say it's the details for a Wi-Fi login, then your phone will follow those instructions and connect you to the specified Wi-Fi network. In our case we use it to take people to a page on a website.






Image of the first donated Pop-Up banner

To aide with publicising of the Group activities at events two Pop-up banners have been designed and donated to the Group which an image of the first banner is shown to the left. The dedication at the bottom of the display reads "Display donated to the group – Remembering happy memories".

A number of the images featured on the banners date back to the early years of the Group and members who no longer walk amongst us or have moved away from the County. All images are of members garden layouts within Kent.

The banners went down very well at their inaugural event at the West Sussex Winter event at Henfield held on Sunday 03 December 2023 by visitors and members of other G Scale Society Groups also at our Teynham event. These will be used in conjunction with the main Society pop up banner.

The displays measures 120cm wide x 200cm tall.
