2024 TENTERDEN MODEL RAILWAY EXHIBITION

The 2024 Tenterden Model Railway Exhibition was organised by the Ashford Model Railway Club over the weekend 10 & 11 February 2024 held at Homewood School, Tenterden within two sports halls. Like last year the Garden of England Railway (GER) layout was located next to the Gauge 1 Society Invicta layout albeit offset by 90 degrees which seemed to improve the flow of visitors around the hall better.

We attended with the layout setting up on the Friday evening. The layout received lots of interest from those attending over the weekend with a lot of interactions front of house between members of the group and members of the public showing interest. 



MY BIG WINTER PROJECT - By Jeff Fray

It all started with my youngest Grandson Odie swinging on the banister rail of our garden decking and it soon became apparent that the posts and the base of the decking had become rotten! It was time after 27 years for it to go. I have always wanted a double track in my garden and at my open days I would use loose lay so more than one train could be ran at any one time. The plans in my head were put in place to alter my garden and my track layout by first talking it over with the other half. First remove the decking and replace it with slabs Secondly make the seating area larger and with the banister rail removed, enlarge the flower beds which in turn would make the lawn smaller.

Removing the decking revealed the original patio of 1200mm concrete slabs which you can still purchase so with help from my youngest son we laid an extra row of slabs making the patio larger. When that work was completed, I started digging out the track bed which caused a problem as I did not realise the amount of soil I would be removing, so where could it go as I did not want to get a skip as most of the rotten decking had been taken to the council tip. Then I had a brain wave, make a large planter out of the decking boards and the wood that had not

rotted and use that earth to fill it.

I wanted a power supply at different points around the garden so I can sit in different positions to control trains from my new mXion and Z21 DCC control system as I did not want to go down the road of hand free and just use hard wire Z21 hand controllers. Installing cables in protective trunking and weather proof sockets undertaken before covering these with concrete.

The wall above was also left quite large amount of rubble but I did need to fill the 3 new track beds before concreting as required to install the extra tracks. Digging down and hammering the rubble into the ground took a while and then I took my time finishing the track beds with concrete with a skin of cement on top with grit pushed into it to give a stone effect for the track to lay on.

Track required. I used the Kent group's Facebook page to ask if anybody had spare track for sale and within minutes a message from Jude, Phil and Ben stating that Phil had been at Chalk Garden Rail in Gravesend and had noticed a large amount of 120cm lengths of second hand LGB track and that saved me £60 which as a result the loose track I used for open days I had enough track to complete what I wanted. At the Pratts Bottom autumn meeting in October, I had purchased 2 sets of points required to move trains from one loop to the other. On my recent visits to members gardens and also on Wayne and Alex's module track I noticed people are using rail clamps so I have decided to use them so I can get good electrical connections between the rails and also a stronger rail connection.

Finishing. I laid the track checking it had the correct clearances both on the straights and the bends, one thing more important is to run the longest trains. Passenger's wagons and goods to ensure the clearances are correct with other walls and buildings in the summer I am planning to secure the track to the track beds with stainless steel screws.

Extra ideas On a recent visit to Richard Bartons' garden I had notice that Richard had used some large chicken wire on the edge of a section of Rack track running high around the back of his garden. He had cut the wire into long strips and had fixed it along the edge to safe guard against trains falling at a high if derailed. On a new part of my double track it runs along a drop onto some steps running down to the bottom of the garden so I used this idea.
